

Happy 215th Birthday MBW

The "Oldest Post of the Corps" celebrated its 215th birthday, April 1, with a cake cutting ceremony. In 1801, President Thomas Jefferson rode through the Nation's Capital with our second commandant, Lt. Col. William Ward Burrows in search of an appropriate site to build a new garrison for the Marine Corps. They selected the site, fondly known as "8th and I", because of the proximity to the Washington Navy Yard and because it was within marching distance to the Capitol building.
