
# DID YOU KNOW?

**Battle of Bladensburg** 



**A Brief History** 

24 August 1814: Captain Samuel Miller's 100-man detachment from Marine Barracks, Washington, fought in the battle of Bladensburg for the defense of the national capital. After helping to fight back three British charges, Captain Miller was wounded and the enemy began to work around both flanks of the American force. Almost encircled, the force of sailors and Marines was forced to retire to avoid capture. The Marines lost 22, 8 killed and 14 wounded.



#### **A Brief History of Center House**

In 1829 a fire destroyed the original Center House (located on the spot currently occupied by quarters III), and it was rebuilt that same year. In 1902, along with all the other Barracks buildings, Center House was demolished. Five years later it was rebuilt in its current location. Center House is the only closed officer's mess in the Marine Corps and it is a symbol of cherished USMC traditions and history.
