The 57 mm field gun on the east side of the parade was captured by Marines in 1900 during the Boxer Rebellion in China. Another large field piece, facing the gun, was captured that same year. The Marines who captured both pieces were under the command of Maj. Waller participating in the international effort to restore order in China. Next to the field guns are two graves. In 1992, the Barracks lost three mascots. Two of them are buried there, the other, ran away.
